Pinky Aiello: First Deaf Woman Professional Juggler & "Pinky Tells the Real Story" a VP/VRS Comedy:

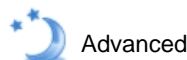

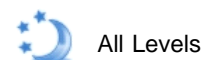

Byron Bridges, RID CDI, was born deaf to deaf parents and grew up with a deaf sister. Dr. Bridges is a certified deaf interpreter (CDI).

Poorna Kushalnagar, Ph.D., grew up mainstreamed with interpreters in the classroom. She is researching quality of life among Deaf and HoH youths.

Tamara Moxham, NIC-M, CI, CT, graduated from Northeastern University's Master Mentor Program in 2004 and has been mentoring ever since.

Julie Simon., Ph.D., CI, CT, has been an Interpreter for over 25 years and served for over 11 years as Administrator for the Western Region Interpreter Education Center at Western Oregon University.

Brian Kilpatrick, Ed.D, BEI IV, Court, RID RSC, is a professional actor and theatrical consultant, was a co-founder of Fairmont Theatre of the Deaf in Cleveland, Ohio and co-founder of Illuminations Arts.

Jana Bielfeldt, BEI III, has been an ASL Instructor for 3 years. She graduated from Lamar University with an MA in Deaf Education/Deaf Studies and a BS from Gallaudet University in 1990.

Ami Hyten is a licensed attorney and the assistant executive director of the Topeka Independent Living Resource Center (TILRC), a disability advocacy and human rights organization in Kansas.

Gina Gonzalez, BEI IV, Trilingual Interpreter, has been a certified interpreter for over 14 years including extensive experience with Trilingual interpreting. She is currently working on a service delivery model in a VRS setting titled: "Caller-Pattern Recognition."

Yolanda Chavira, BEI III, Trilingual Interpreter, is the lead coordinator for the Hispanic Texas Trilingual Initiative test development being performed in partnership between DHHS and the University of Arizona; she is a member of the Panel of Experts for that project.
